What is DSRIP?

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DSRIP is a program that transforms the healthcare delivery system

- 5-year program that transforms the overall delivery of healthcare
- Administered by NY State Department of Health with federal funds from Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS)
- Medicaid is a \$6.42 billion program impacting 5.8 million Medicaid beneficiaries in New York

DSRIP Goal

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- Reduce avoidable hospital use by 25% by the end of the five-year program (2020)
- **Avoidable** inpatient admissions and **avoidable** emergency room visits

What is a PPS?

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- A PPS is made up of DSRIP partners, which include community based organizations and both major public general hospitals and safety and non-safety net providers
- PPS partners are responsible for performing a DSRIP project by collaborating together, with a designated lead provider for the group

What is a PPS?

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- There are 25 Performing Provider Systems (PPSs) across New York State that are participating in DSRIP. **Bronx Health Access (BHA)** is a PPS and Bronx Lebanon is the PPS lead
- BHA partners include: Hospitals; Medicaid and uninsured beneficiaries; Physicians; CBOs; Social Service entities; Behavioral Providers; and Community Coalitions

Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment program- What does this mean?

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- Delivery System – how our patients get their healthcare
 - Through hospitals, clinics, private practice physicians, behavioral health providers, long-term care providers and more



Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment program- What does this mean?

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□ Reform

- In order to meet the DSRIP goal we must **change** (reform) the way Medicaid beneficiaries get healthcare
- Providers will **change** the way they deliver care

Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment program- What does this mean?

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□ Incentive Payment

- Money to developing the infrastructure and clinical services to support population health
- The state will give funds to the PPS if the PPS shows that it is making **progress**
- The PPS will give funds to providers if the providers show they are making **progress***

*A future webinar will cover incentive payments and how providers can earn them. The funds flow has not yet been developed.

Changing the Business of Health Care: DSRIP Projects:

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- Shift from providing care for episodic illness to health and wellness
 - ▣ Financial structure that focuses on health (VBP) rather than illness (FFS)
- Migration of care from inpatient/ED to outpatient and community settings
- Team centered approach to providing care
- Centralized coordination of care
- Addressing social determinants of health
- Electronic communication of care plans and outcomes across all providers/organizations

Key Elements for All Projects

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- All projects have common elements
 - Patient inclusion and exclusion criteria / Assessment
 - Provider engagement
 - Medical plan
 - Care Plan (addressing social determinants)
 - Require collaboration/communication of PCP and Care Coordinator

Ten BHA projects to meet the DSRIP goal

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Project	Description
2.a.i	Create Integrated Delivery Systems that are focused on Evidence Based Medicine./Population Health Management
2.a.iii	Health Home At-Risk Intervention Program- Proactive management of high risk patents not currently eligible for Health Homes through access to high quality primary care and support services
2.b.iv	Care transitions intervention model to reduce 30 day readmissions for chronic health conditions
2.b.i	Create ambulatory ICUs for patients with multiple co-morbidities including non-physician interventions for stabilized patients with chronic care needs.
3.a.i	Integration of mental health and substance abuse with primary care services to ensure coordination of care for both services.
3.c.i	Evidence-based strategies for disease management in high risk/affected populations (adults only). To support implementation of evidence-based best practices for disease management in medical practice.
3.d.ii	Expansion of asthma home-based self-management program
3.f.i	Increase support programs for maternal & child health (including high risk pregnancies) (Example: Nurse-Family Partnership)
4.a.iii.	Strengthen Mental Health and Substance Abuse Infrastructure across Systems
4.c.ii	Increase early access to, and retention in HIV care

What is Bronx Health Access PPS?

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- A coalition of more than 200 organizations serving patients in the Bronx
- Bronx Health Access is the overarching provider system for the Bronx Lebanon Hospital Center Performing Provider System (BLHC PPS)
- Bronx Lebanon Hospital Center is the lead entity

How do I become part of the BHA or PPS?

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Organizations and individual providers are considered participating in the BHA network if they complete the following required submissions:

- ❑ Signed an MOU **OR**
- ❑ Signed an attestation

AND

- ❑ Add your NPI to PPS Network

AND

- ❑ Signed a PPS Provider Agreement (sent to all providers April 14, 2015) and completed the IT, compliance and financial status surveys

What does DSRIP mean for your patients?

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- Improved communication between care providers: PCP, Specialty, Behavioral Health, care coordinator, etc.
